



Self-Declaration for use of Accessible Collections

Eligibility Criteria

Under the provisions of the Canadian Copyright Act, “perceptual disability” means an impairment that prevents or inhibits a person from reading or hearing a literary, musical, dramatic or artistic work in its original format and includes a disability resulting from:

- a) Severe or total impairment of sight or hearing or the inability to focus or move one’s eyes
- b) The inability to hold or manipulate a book
- c) An impairment relating to comprehension

The library may request verification from a qualifying certifying professional in the field of disabilities services, education, medicine, psychology, or public agencies (social workers, case workers, counselors).

Self-Declaration

- I certify that I am a person with a perceptual disability based on the provided definition. I understand that the library reserves the right to ask for verification from a qualifying certifying professional.
- Accessible material is for my personal use only. I will not copy, share, or redistribute accessible materials.
